During the interactive tour, **Local 40 Business Manager Dave Roche and Business Representative Jeremy Zeedyk**, demonstrated a new HVAC

safety initiative called "HVAC Fire Life Safety Program", which is the first of its kind in the country. The system is installed and maintained by highly trained sheet metal workers.

The day highlighted how the biopharmaceutical industry and labor work together in Connecticut to build new facilities, stimulate job growth, encourage innovation, support the local economy and create life-saving cures.
